

Word from your Pastor...

Telling Our Story

"Tell me the old, old story, of unseen things above. Of Jesus and his glory, of Jesus and his love. -Kate Hankey, author of the lyrics of "Tell Me the Old, Old Story."

Kate Hankey served as a missionary in South Africa. In 1866, she had a serious illness and was bedridden for a very long convalescence. During this time, Hankey wrote her poem, *The Old, Old Story*, which later became a hymn. The hymn, "Tell Me the Old, Old Story," was one of my favorites as a child.

As we enter the season of Lent on February 14, (yes, Ash Wednesday is also Valentine's Day this year), I invite you to reflect on your life story, perhaps even write it down. Lent is a time for reflection. We are all writing our story each day of our lives, but most often we are not mindful of it. So this year, remember how your story began. What events and people in your childhood were important? How did you grow into an adult? What were the first great choices of your life? What have you found is the most important for you to do? Where you are today?

We have one precious possession that cannot be taken from us. It is our story. We get to write it, edit it, change it as we go along, and decide how it ends. Lent is a good time to look at our own, special story. To search for God in it, and to recognize the people in it who have changed our lives.

As a minister, I have the remarkable opportunity to watch you as you write your stories. Stories that are deep and quiet. Stories that are noisy and filled with challenges and blind alleys. Stories of how you have faced each step, each difficulty, each important decision with faith and hope.

As I write this article today, one of our beloved members is writing her story through the difficult challenge of a long and painful illness. She, like Kate Hankey, has found herself in bed, time and time again. She, like Kate Hankey, has written down her story for us to share. Her name is Laura Keating, and here is a sample of the latest chapter of her story:

"It's been a very long time since I've been able to post anything hopeful and upbeat. Treatment after treatment has failed, and my body seems to have become even more of my enemy. Since December, I have been deeply depressed; just trying to focus on symptom management. Some days, I have felt I had lost all hope.

But as I write to you today, my heart is exploding with hope. Last week a new opportunity landed in my lap. I am a candidate for a hematopoietic stem cell transplant (HSCT). There have been a few others with my rare diagnosis (AAG) who have been treated with HSCT, and they are no longer on TPN, can eat by mouth, and got their lives back. The even better news is that is that the one place I can receive this treatment is Northwestern in Chicago! If I am able to have the treatment, I will be in the hospital for many weeks.

My body is about to be destroyed and rebuilt, and it is going to be a really long recovery. And while this all happens, my kids are going to be without their mom for long periods of time. So, please pray for them. Thanks for sharing this journey with me. Love to all of you." Laura
